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...as opposed to a periodic physical that inspects for bad things.




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### **AQIP Pros**

It redefines the accreditation relationship from one of mere compliance to one of formative interaction for positive change on individual campuses.



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


#### **AQIP Cons (for many organizations)**

- · Requires an institutional commitment to systematic quality efforts.
- · Expects broad involvement of faculty, staff, and other constituents.
- Requires lots of time, work, and wisdom.



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## **AQIP Cons: Not for institutions that** <u>are...</u>

- averse to planning, enjoy big surprises
- firmly entrenched in the past, content, self-satisfied
- prefer to treat problems, issues, or challenges episodically ("put out fires")
- · see accreditation as adversarial, a "necessary evil."
